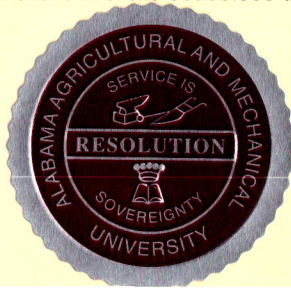


WHEREAS, Dr. John Wesley Hall will be forever remembered for his devotion to family, his profession and the higher education arena, his community and his church ...
