WHEREAS, Dr. Olivia Harris Sanders began her quest for higher education at Miles College, where she majored in biology and minored in chemistry and English; went on to earn the M.Ed. degree and AA certification in school administration from Alabama A&M University; and then obtained the doctorate degree in curriculum development and supervision from the University of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Olivia Harris Sanders' lengthy career embodies her service as an assistant librarian at the Southside Branch of the Birmingham Public Library; as a second grade teacher for Birmingham Public Schools; as a biology and chemistry teacher at Fairfield Industrial High School, Fairfield, Ala.; and as AAMU professor and director of the AAMU-UAH Regional In-Service Education Center; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Oliva Harris Sanders has also worked as an instructor for the Madison County (Ala.) Board of Education, as well as a job counselor, instructional specialist and curriculum specialist; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Olivia Harris Sanders was actively affiliated with Ascension Lutheran Church (Huntsville), Alpha Kappa the National Education Association, the Alabama Education Association, NAACP, the International Reading Association and People United to Save Humanity (PUSH); and

WHEREAS, Dr. Olivia Harris Sanders deserves continuing tribute and proud recognition for her unwavering love of historic Alabama A&M University, and for her consistent devotion to the education of men and women throughout the state ...
