

Patton Hall



Patton Hall opened in 1971 as the L.R. Patton Administration and Classroom Building. This 50,000 square feet, three-level building served as the home for the Office of the President and as an academic classroom space for the School of Education, the Department of English and Foreign Languages and the Department of Psychology and Counseling.

The L. R. Patton Administration and Classroom Building was named by special resolution, on July 13, 1971, in honor of Dr. Leander Raphael Patton, Alabama A & M University's Vice President for Business and Finance. (1971-1985). Today, the Patton Building serves as the office of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, Admissions, Business and Finance, Financial Aid, Career and Development Services, General Counsel, Information Technology, Marketing and Communications and the Graduate School, Office of the Registrar, Student Affairs, and other academic and support services units.
